



by Annie Barrows



In the summer of 1938, Layla Beck's father, a United States senator, cuts off her allowance and demands that she find employment on the Federal Writers' Project, a New Deal jobs program. 
Lenten Soup Suppers






CONVICTED - A WORSHIP SERIES FOR LENT

February 14 (Ash Wednesday) - Defamation of Character

Step into the courtroom each week in Lent with our Convicted worship series. Each service puts a different biblical person from the story of Christ's passion and death on trial, accused of an actual crime. On Ash Wednesday, we will look at the case against Jesus' disciples on the charge of defamation of character against the woman who anointed Jesus.

February 21 - Dereliction of Duty

Step into the courtroom once again in the next service in our Convicted worship series, in which a different biblical person from the story of Christ's passion and death is on trial in each service, accused of an actual crime. In this week's service, we will look at the case against Jesus' disciples on the charge of dereliction of duty.

February 28 - Treason

Step into the courtroom once again in the next service in our Convicted worship series, in which a different biblical person from the story of Christ's passion and death is on trial in each service, accused of an actual crime. In this week's service, we will look at the case against Judas on the charge of treason, a betrayal of trust against authority.

March 6 - Perjury

Step into the courtroom once again in the next service in our Convicted worship series, in which a different biblical person from the story of Christ's passion and death is on trial in each service, accused of an actual crime. In this week's service, we will look at the case against Peter on the charge of perjury, denying under an oath that he knew Jesus.

March 13 - Obstruction of Justice

Step into the courtroom once again in the next service in our Convicted worship series, in which a different biblical person from the story of Christ's passion and death is on trial in each service, accused of an actual crime. In this week's service, we will look at the case against Pontius Pilate on the charge of obstruction of justice, for not letting Jesus go free.

March 20 - Rebellion

Step into the courtroom once again in the next service in our Convicted worship series, in which a different biblical person from the story of Christ's passion and death is on trial in each service, accused of an actual crime. In this week's service, we will look at the case against Barabbas on the charge of rebellion.



The Diakonia Program

Growing in Faith is a ministry within the ELCA committed to fostering learning environments for followers of Jesus to grow in faith. We believe that lay members of our parishes are integral to healthy discipleship in our churches and communities. Thus, we gather followers across congregations to grow in faith together. Growing in Faith is a series of classes that you can take all in one year or over the course of many years. The courses are offered collaboratively through Zoom with Northwest Ohio Synod. Each course runs for 5 weeks and costs \$65/course + credit card fees (this is the suggested course fee plus a small amount for celebrations at the end of the year). The following courses will be taught on Thursdays from 6-9pm through Zoom this Spring:

INTRODUCTION TO THE NEW TESTAMENT

February 8, 15, 22, 29, March 7

The goals of this course are to understand the gospel message as revealed in the New Testament (NT), to explore the life and faith of the Christian church in the first century, to understand how the Bible came down to us in its present form, and to understand and use a variety of tools for interpreting the Bible. Throughout the course students will reflect on how the New Testament Gospel has shaped our Christian lives.

LIVING AS A CHRISTIAN IN THE WORLD

March 21, April 4, 11, 18, 25

no class on Thursday, March 28th - Maundy Thursday

Students will discuss and explore their role as a member of a Christian community and the community at large. This course allows students to explore their place in a community that is not necessarily predominately Christian.

LUTHERAN CREEDS AND CONFESSIONS

May 9, 16, 23, 30, June 6

This course provides an analysis of the historical context and theological content of the Book of Concord (the Lutheran Confessions) with an eye to establishing the importance of its witness for Christian mission and ministry.
